ACCESS TO TE MARUA COURSE FACILITIES

In a "Standard" week the course is open for play every day, with tee times available through the day.

Start sheets operate 7 days per week and will typically be updated to show bookings for any Wellington Golf (WGI) events, visiting golfers (including corporate and social groups) and Te Marua Golf Club members. If in doubt, call the Club Shop (04)5267020 to confirm course availability BEFORE travelling to our course.

All players must report to the Shop before starting their round.

Please:

- Repair divots by replacing and firmly stamping down the divot and level the immediate area to leave a relatively flat space from which a ball can be hit
- On the greens, repair ball marks / pitch marks, yours and ideally one or two extras that your ball did not make (visit <u>How to repair a pitch mark</u>)
- Keep trundlers off greens and tees
- Keep motorized ride-on carts and trikes on higher, drier ground, well away from the greens and away from areas which tend to collect water when it rains
- Play with consideration for other golfers on the course

Any variations to the Te Marua's schedule and/or competition conditions will be advised by notice(s) posted on the Club Notice Boards, the Club's weekly newsletter and/or the News pages on the Club's website - www.temaruagolfclub.co.nz

Competition Conditions will specify the format of the event and eligibility for participation, both of which will likely vary from one competition to another.

Unless stated otherwise in an event's Competition Conditions, Club Trophy events are open only to Te Marua Golf Club members.

The DotGolf scorecard printing system provides the option to enter competition(s) of the day.

The Golf NZ Website's 'Competitions' page will be updated with results as scorecards are returned and entered into the DotGolf system.

Scorecards are generally entered on the day of play, but those returned late in the day will most likely be entered the following day.

SHARING YOUR GOLF COURSE

Members are welcome to bring guests on most days but should confirm through the Tee Booking system and/or The Shop that there will be no clash with formal club and/or corporate events. Guests must be introduced to the Duty Manager in the Shop and obtain a Green Fee ticket to attach to their golf bag.

Te Marua Golf Club members are expected to ensure their guests comply with all course rules and regulations, particularly as they relate to care of the course and pace of play.

Please contact The Shop to confirm current Green Fees payable by visitors on the proposed date.

CELL PHONES

In consideration of all other golfers, cell phones should be switched to silent alert and used only when necessary.

RIDE-ON TRANSPORTATION

Ride-on Golf Carts are available for hire and should be booked in advance. They may be used in all Te Marua Golf Club Competitions when course conditions permit.

Privately owned ride-on Golf Carts and Trikes may be used only with written approval from the Executive Committee. Such approval may be withdrawn at any time. Users of privately owned Golf Carts or Trikes must comply with all rules set down for the use of the Golf Carts available for hire, particularly keeping the Carts at least well away from Greens and Tee areas.

For protection of the course during adverse ground and/or weather conditions, the use of ride-on transportation may be prohibited at the discretion of the Duty Manager / Administrator in consultation with Club Captain and/or Match Convenor.

COMPETITIONS – DEFINITIONS and CONDITIONS

All Te Marua Golf Club's competitions are defined by the Match Committee for the relevant playing category (Midweek Men, Women, Weekend) and where appropriate, in consideration of any conditions set by the sponsor(s) of the competition.

The relevant Match Committee has the discretion to the alter the schedule of events, definition of an event and/or competition conditions. Any such changes will be notified well in advance of the event.

Competition conditions may include restrictions on playing dates, times and specify other eligibility criteria.

ARRANGING OF MATCHES – ALL MEMBERS

Preliminary round and Semi-Final matches must be played on or before the stipulated date. If players are unable to agree a date, the play by date takes precedence. Finals matches must be played ON the specified date.

Should the player(s) be unavailable for the set date, then the unavailable player - or players - will be required to default the match. The Match Committee may replace the defaulting player(s) with the player(s) defeated in the prior round.

Considering the above conditions, players should confirm their availability for the Semi-finals and Finals <u>and</u> the Reserve Dates BEFORE entering any multi-round Matchplay event.

POSTPONEMENTS

Postponements caused by inclement weather will be managed at the time. If possible, reserve days will be used. As a last resort, new dates will be set, and participants will be required to play on those dates or to seek approval from the Match Committee for the match to be played on another date.

PROTESTS

When it is intended to protest the player should, as well as complying with the R&A Rules of Golf, notify a member of the Match Committee, through the On-Duty Manager / Administrator, that he/she intends to protest. Unless the intention to protest is notified prior to or immediately after the completion of the game, the protest may not be considered.

If a member of the Match Committee is unavailable at the time the protest is lodged, the card should be marked "Protest" and left with the Duty Manager / Administrator for follow up action.

HOLE IN ONE

The following conditions apply to a hole-in-one.

- Any member who scores a hole-in-one at home while playing a "Stipulated Round" at Te Marua shall have the feat recognized and have their name entered on the "Perfect Shot" Honours Board PROVIDED:
 - A scorecard signed by player and a marker affiliated to NZ Golf is returned
 - Digital scorecards must include the membership id for the 'attested' marker
 - The "Stipulated Round" of either 9 or 18 holes was played as a formal round, one which will be recorded for handicap purposes
- A hole-in-one at home qualifies the member for up to \$150 in the bar on the day of the achievement - or reimbursement of up to \$100 if scored at another Club. In the latter case, the player's name will not be entered on the Te Marua Golf Club's Perfect Shot Honours board.
- In the event of a member scoring a hole-in-one on a day when the bar is closed, the "shout" may be postponed until the next available and convenient day – confirmation of the new date to be arranged in consultation with the Match Committee and/or Caterers.

MIXED WEEKEND COMPETITIONS

OPENING DAY: JAMES MAHER TRAYS - Better Ball STABLEFORD — mixed or non-mixed pairs playing in 1 competition. Arrange own partners, not necessarily playing in the same group.

ARTHUR AVIS MEMORIAL DAY: Better Ball Stableford – mixed or non-mixed pairs playing in 1 competition. Arrange own partners, not necessarily playing in the same group.

TE MARUA VETERAN'S TROPHIES: Open to all members aged 50 and over.

CHRISTMAS CHEERS: – Stableford for Charity

CLOSING DAY: GETHING TROPHY – Better Ball STABLEFORD – mixed or non-mixed pairs playing in 1 competition. Arrange own partners, not necessarily playing in the same group.

JUNIOR COMPETITIONS

DON HAZLETT TROPHY: 36 holes Net Medal using the player's best 2 of 4 x 18 hole scores. Open to Club members, male and female, under 23 years of age at time of first round.

MEN'S WEEKEND COMPETITIONS

CONDITIONS OF PLAY:

To participate in managed competitions, players must be on the tee no later than 1.00 p.m.

CHAMPIONSHIPS: For all championship events there will be three divisions:

Senior Intermediate Junior

Division handicap boundaries will be reviewed, set, and published approaching the date of the event. Championship events are restricted to members with Full Playing privileges at the time the event is held.

MATCHPLAY CHAMPIONSHIP:

All qualifying rounds and matches are played "off the stick" using the player's Gross scores for each round/hole.

MATCHPLAY CHAMPIONSHIP **FINALS** will be decided over 36 holes.

Qualifying: 36 holes of Strokeplay Gross) played in conjunction with the Strokeplay Championships and using the player's best 2 x 18-hole Gross scores from the available 4 x 18-hole rounds. The first 16 in each division qualify for that division's Matchplay Championships.

Halved Matches. Any Te Marua Golf Club Trophy or Title match, which is all square after the last stipulated hole, is to continue beyond the 19th hole until one side or the other wins a hole - The 19th is the hole at which the match started. e.g., Started at #10,then #10 is the 19th

STROKEPLAY CHAMPIONSHIPS: 72-holes of Strokeplay using the player's best 3 x 18-hole Gross scores from the available 4 x 18-hole rounds. Any ties will be resolved by a play-off round which will be arranged by the Match Committee in consultation with the players involved.

ADE WADDELL MEMORIAL: Four-Ball, Best-Ball Matchplay on Handicap from the lowest handicap in the match.

Each pair to be one Senior, one Junior at the time of the first round. Division handicap boundaries will be reviewed, set, and published approaching the date of the event. Arrange own partners, draw for opponents.

NOTE: This is NOT a Stableford event.

AMBASSADORS CUP: 18 holes Par-on-handicap competition.

AUSTAD CUP: Par-on-Handicap competition over 2 x 18-hole rounds on separate days.

BOLT CUP: 36 holes Net Medal played alongside the Strokeplay Championships using the player's best 2 x 18-hole Net Medal scores from available 4 x 18-hole rounds.

ERIC COLE CUP: Awarded to the player returning the most Interclub match points for the Club's top interclub team

GOLFER OF THE YEAR: Qualifying over multiple rounds through the year for an 18-hole FINAL, the winner of which earns the right to ask, under strict conditions, any Full Playing MALE club member to buy him a beer (or non-alcoholic drink).

HASTWELL CUP: Stableford (Course handicap of 15-36 handicap) played on same day as Pope Cup.

HUI NGAPARU TROPHY: 18 holes Net Medal played on Waitangi Day.

SUMMER CUP: 36 holes Net Medal using the player's best 2×18 -hole Net Medal scores from the available 3×18 -hole rounds.

INVICTA TROPHY: 36 holes Stableford from 2 x 18-hole rounds *NOTE: PLAYED ON SATURDAYS*.

MAYER & KEAN CUP: 54 holes Net Medal played alongside the Strokeplay Championships using the player's best 3 x 18-hole Net Medal scores from available 4 x 18-hole rounds.

MONTY'S MUG: Awarded for the most recent best gross score from the BLUE TEES between opening and closing days. (e.g. 62 in June, 62 in August, August wins.)

POPE CUP: Stableford. (Up to Course Handicap of 14) played on same day as the Hastwell Cup.

JIM PARKIN CUP: 18 holes Stableford – Murray Halberg Trust Day.

MEN'S WEEKDAY COMPETITIONS

The schedule of weekday competitions may be altered at any time at the discretion of the Mid-Week Match Committee.

CHAMPIONSHIPS

Matchplay <u>on Handicap</u> in 3 divisions – Registration is required for this event.

NOTE: This is NOT a STABLEFORD event.



STALWART SHIELD: 4BBB Matchplay, drawn partners

BILL ADAM TROPHY: Best Stableford, played on day of midvear luncheon.

ERIC PIERCE CUP: Net Medal on Closing Day.

WOMEN'S WEEKEND COMPETITIONS

MATCHPLAY CHAMPIONSHIPS:

The Matchplay Championships will be played from a 'seeded' draw. There will be two divisions based on handicap index at the time of the draw. Confirm no change

Silver: Up to 18.4 Bronze: From 18.5

All rounds except the Finals will be played over 18 holes on one specified day. Finals for all divisions will be over 36 holes.

STROKEPLAY CHAMPIONSHIPS: 36 holes Strokeplay played on specified days in Silver and Bronze Divisions. Gross and Net Medal.

AUSTAD CUP: An Eclectic competition played in conjunction with L.G.U. Medal rounds. Played Sundays and/or Wednesdays.

DOROTHY PALMER TROPHY: Two rounds Strokeplay on handicap.

DUNCAN VASE: Weekend Eclectic, Bronze division.

FAY JONES TROPHY: Best Stableford over 18 holes Weekday & Weekend.

LEDSHAM SALVER: Weekend Eclectic, Silver Division. Played Sundays and/or Wednesdays.

LIL PARKIN CUP: Stableford – Murray Halberg Trust Day.

NATIONAL TEAMS EVENT: Medal Round, best 4 Net scores from Weekend and Weekday play in the Provincial Final.

NANCY McCORMICK FOURSOMES: 36 holes Foursomes NZ Home Links Event.

L.G.U. Annual NZ Gold Badges: The lowest aggregate of 6 Net Medal differentials, 2 divisions, Played Sundays and/or Wednesdays.

LIL PARKIN TROPHY: Stableford, to be played on Waitangi Day, 6th February.

SESQUI TROPHY: Putting played on L.G.U. days, using the totals from the player's best 4 rounds. Played Sundays and/or Wednesdays.

SUMMER TRAYS: Qualify in 3 divisions then Matchplay on handicap.

ECLECTICS: Except for Matchplay, 18 holes must be played before eclectics can be counted. In Matchplay, if a match has finished, eclectics for holes played can be counted without completing the round. When the daily competition is two rounds, eclectics can be scored on both rounds.

Summer, weekend Eclectics, and Austad Cup are all less half-handicap.

Summer Eclectics may be submitted from Closing to Opening Day.

WOMEN'S WEEKDAY COMPETITIONS

Register by 9:15am for a disc draw at 9:20am and play starting at 9:30am. Women's weekday competitions can be rescheduled at the discretion of the Weekday Match Committee.

MATCHPLAY CHAMPIONSHIPS:

The Matchplay Championships will be played from a 'seeded' draw. There will be two divisions based on handicap index at the time of the draw. Proposed divisions, to be confirmed:

Silver: Up to 18.4 Bronze: From 18.5

If numbers allow there will be a Bronze2 division for handicap index range of 29.3 to 54.0

The Silver division finals will be played over 36 holes, the Bronze1 and Bronze2 divisions over 18 holes.

STROKEPLAY CHAMPIONSHIPS:

36 holes of Strokeplay over 2 separate days in 2 Divisions - Silver and Bronze. Gross and Net Medal for each Division.

ECLECTIC COMPETITION: Weekday eclectics may be counted on all Women's Weekday Club days. Eclectics are less half handicap. Vi Porter Trophy for winner and Nan Saunders Tray for runner-up (If the winner is Silver the tray goes to the best Bronze & vice versa).

AUSTAD CUP: An Eclectic competition played in conjunction with L.G.U. Medal rounds. Played Sundays and/or Wednesdays.

FAY JONES TROPHY: Best S/F over 18 holes Weekday & Weekend.

FRANCES COLE TROPHY: Net Medal over all divisions.

GOBBLER: Runs throughout the year for the most 'chip-ins'.

GRANNIES DAY: Stableford Competition, no divisions.

L.G.U.: Monthly Medal Round for LGU Badge over all divisions. Annual Trophy for the lowest aggregate of 6 Net Medal differentials, 3 divisions.

L.G.U. Annual NZ Gold Badges: The lowest aggregate of 6 Net Medal differentials, 2 divisions, Played Sundays and/or Wednesdays.

MARGUERITE FITZGIBBONS TROPHY: Best Stableford over all divisions to be played on Closing Day.

NANCY McCORMICK MEMORIAL FOURSOMES: 36 holes Foursomes NZ Home Links Event.

NAN SAUNDERS TROPHY: Trophy for runner-up to best eclectic over the season.

NATIONAL TEAMS EVENT: Medal Round, best 4 Net scores from Weekend & Weekday play in the Provincial Final.

TRANS TASMAN TROPHY: Best overall Net score from Strokeplay Championships.

SESQUI TROPHY: Putting played on L.G.U. days, using the totals from the player's best 4 rounds. Played either Sundays or Wednesdays.

SUMMER TRAYS: Matchplay on handicap.

VETERANS TROPHY: Stableford. Open to Women 50 years of age and over on day of entry.
